First, we are going to create a pamphlet that is *Post-specific* that we will use at our recruitment events - extolling the virtues of the benefits of joining our Post. At our last Staff meeting, we discussed ways to increase our collections by dropping mon-productive locations and replacing them with better locations. Again - this all depends on securing enough volunteers to staff these locations.

An aside from the normal Poppy collections, we were pleasantly surprised to receive a check from Lynfred Winery last week for \$405. The winery does not collect tips but accepts donations to a local charity or organization of their choice every month.

In May they contributed their collections to VFW Post 981. Dale and I went and thanked them for their donation to our Poppy Fund and, using their Veteran's discount, left with two cases of wine! Two other new "things": our business cards, when reordered, will have, in addition to the VFW logo, our meeting date, time, and location. So when you pass out your card the recipient has all the information he/she needs to find us.

We also now have a new phone number on our Post website (thanks to our previous Commander Matt Voss). It's a Google voice mailbox number. It directs a voicemail to the Commander's phone number and a transcribed message to the Commander's email.

POST 2023 SCHOLARSHIPS

At the June Post meeting Eva Mason received the \$3,000 Wally Luetschwager Scholarship Grant. Morgan Lamb was the recipient of the \$3,000 scholarship donated by late member Bob Henderson's family. Finally Julie Olson received a \$1,500 scholarship.

Eva Mason is a resident of Arlington Heights and graduated in 2023 from Buffalo Grove High School. She will be attending Purdue University where she hopes to major in Bio-Medical Engineering. Both grandfathers served during the Korean War, one Army and one Navy, and one was a member of Post 981 before he passed away.

Julia lives in Arlington Heights and just graduated from Rolling Meadows High School, attaining a GPA of 4.0. She is planning to attend the University of Illinois Urbana to major in Music Performance and Marketing. Her grandfather served during the Korean War and her aunt is a Navy veteran.

Morgan has started a non-profit organization that gives free haircuts to veterans and the homeless community. She has been active in supporting veteran causes for years. POPPY DAY COLLECTIONS

Our Poppy Chairman, Henry Mueller continued his fantastic job organizing this valuable fund raiser. On May 21 Post members were at 8 locations in Arlington Heights and at 7 locations in Buffalo Grove on May 28.

The final collection total was \$3,421 in Arlington Heights and \$2,566 in Buffalo Grove. This was more than last year by \$321 (not counting a \$500 donation by Meyer's in 2022). In addition, Roger

Santagato manned a table at Memorial Park before, during and after the Arlington Heights Memorial Day ceremony, bringing in \$382 profit on hat sales and donations. Total Memorial Day proceeds came to \$6,369.

A list of worthwhile organizations will be submitted to the Post to receive our Poppy money. Ideas for spending the Poppy fund are always welcome.


